Reflection

During this sacred season of Lent, we pause to reflect on who we are and whose we are. As we honor Women's History Month, we celebrate the strength, faith, sacrifice, and leadership of women throughout history and in our own lives. Lent calls us to repentance and renewal—but also to recognition: every woman is fearfully and wonderfully made, created with divine purpose. As we journey toward the cross, may we affirm the dignity, gifts, and calling of women in every generation.

March is recognized as Women's History Month—a time to honor and celebrate the contributions of women from every culture and in every sphere of life. This year, March is especially meaningful for Christians as it falls during the Lenten season—a time of reflection, repentance, renewal, and preparation.

As we journey through Lent, we are reminded that every person is created with divine intention and purpose. Psalm 139:14 declares that we are “fearfully and wonderfully made,” and Ephesians 2:10 affirms that we are God's workmanship, created for good works. - Do we participate in gender bias when discussing actions, behaviors, or qualifications?
- How do Psalm 139:14 and Ephesians 2:10 shape our understanding of the treatment, value, and leadership of women?

Activities

- Host a book drive or tutoring initiative highlighting the contributions of women in history, theology, science, arts, and civic life.
- Facilitate a discussion about the women who have influenced your life and how their faith and leadership shaped your actions.
- Study and discuss the women in the life and ministry of Jesus, and explore why their stories are significant during the Lenten season.
