## **RESURRECTION OF SPIRITUAL LIFE & THE RENEWAL OF CREATION**



### **Resurrection of Spiritual Life & The Renewal of Creation Scriptures: John 11:25–26; 1 Corinthians 15:20; Acts 2:31–32**

#### **Reflection**

Easter proclaims that death does not have the final word. The resurrection of Christ brings hope, restoration, and new beginnings. As spring awakens the earth, we are reminded that God is always at work bringing life from what once seemed dormant.

This month, we celebrate both the risen Christ and the renewal of creation, committing ourselves to spiritual growth and faithful stewardship of the Earth. April begins during Holy Week, with Easter falling on the first Sunday of the month. In 1 Corinthians 15:20, Christ is described as the “first fruits” of the resurrection—signifying both promise and fulfillment. The concept of first fruits also reflects renewal, growth, and the reawakening of life seen in springtime.



April is also recognized as Earth Month. Therefore, April 2026 offers a powerful opportunity to reflect on both the resurrection of Christ and the renewal of creation. Just as Christ rose, we witness signs of new life emerging in the natural world—reminding us that God is continually restoring and renewing.

### **Questions for Journaling/Discussion**

- Why is the resurrection of Christ essential to our faith?
- What signs signal the arrival of spring and new life?
- How do we honor Christ through the way we care for the Earth?
- In what ways does spiritual renewal mirror the renewal we see in creation?

### **Activities**

- Demonstrate care for God’s creation by organizing a community cleanup, participating in native planting initiatives, or volunteering at a hospital, senior living facility, or school.
- Create an intergenerational recording (poem, essay, dramatic reading, dance, or song) that celebrates the resurrection and God’s creation.
- Plant a “Resurrection Garden” as a symbolic act of hope and renewal.
