Purpose

The goal of the September Intergenerational Challenge is to help every generation recognize that God has given them gifts, talents, experiences, and opportunities to make an impact for His Kingdom.

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Theme Scripture -1 Peter 4:10 (KJV)

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God has placed something valuable inside every generation. Whether young or seasoned, everyone has gifts that can be used to serve God, strengthen the church, and bless others.



Scripture Reflection Requirement

Participants must submit at least one scripture reflection describing what they learned and how God's Word influenced their experience.

Reflection questions may include:

- What gifts has God placed within you?
- What did you learn from someone of another generation?
- How can your gifts help build God's Kingdom?
- How did serving alongside another generation affect you?
- What will you do differently because of this experience?
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Reflections may be written, recorded by video, or shared as a brief testimony.



Week 1 — Discover Your Gift

Activity

Talk with someone from another generation about your gifts and talents. Ask one another: "What gift do you see in me that God can use?"

Scripture

Romans 12:6-"Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us..."

Reflection

We do not all have the same gifts, but every gift matters. Sometimes another person can recognize something God has placed within us before we recognize it ourselves.

Submit

Photos, written responses, spiritual gift discoveries, or testimonies.



Week 2 — Teach Me Something Activity

Participate in an Intergenerational Skill Exchange. Have someone from an older generation teach a younger person something, and have the younger person teach something in return.

Ideas include cooking, technology, budgeting, gardening, Bible knowledge, sewing, music, social media, home repairs, or another life skill.

Scripture

Proverbs 27:17-"Iron sharpeneth iron; so a man sharpeneth the countenance of his friend."

Reflection

Every generation has something to teach and something to learn. God uses relationships to sharpen us and help us grow.

Submit

Photos, videos, descriptions of what was learned, or reflections.



Week 3 — Use Your Gift to Serve Activity

Use one of your gifts to bless someone else. Sing, cook, teach, encourage, organize, pray, visit someone, help a ministry, or perform another act of service.

Scripture

Galatians 5:13-"By love serve one another."

Reflection

God does not give us gifts simply for ourselves. Our gifts become Kingdom gifts when they are used to serve others.

Submit

Photos, testimonies, service records, or reflections.



Week 4 — Kingdom Dreamers Activity

Pair with someone from another generation and discuss:
"If there were no limitations, what would you love to see God do through our church and community?"

Write down your Kingdom dreams and pray over them together.

Scripture

Ephesians 3:20-"Now unto him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think..."

Reflection

God can accomplish more than we can imagine. When generations dream, pray, and work together, the church becomes stronger.

Submit

Kingdom ideas, prayers, pictures, videos, or testimonies.



Church-Wide Challenge

Throughout September:

- Encourage someone from another generation.
- Discover a gift in another person and tell them.
- Learn one new skill.
- Teach someone something you know.
- Use one of your gifts to serve the church or community.
- Pray for God to reveal where He wants to use you.

Scripture

Ephesians 4:12-"For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ."



Participation Recognition

Participants may submit pictures, videos, testimonies, journal entries, ministry participation, written reflections, and other evidence of participation.

Recognition will be based on the number and extent of activities completed and submission of at least one scripture reflection.

You are not too young. You are not too old. You are not too late. God has equipped every generation for Kingdom impact.
